### WELCOME SPRING FLOWERS

May is a month of spring in the Northern Hemisphere, and autumn in the Southern Hemisphere. Therefore, May in the Southern Hemisphere is the seasonal equivalent of November in the Northern Hemisphere and vice versa. Late May typically marks the start of the summer vacation season in the United States (Memorial Day) and Canada (Victoria Day).

May was named for the Greek goddess Maia, who was identified with the Roman era goddess of fertility, Bona Dea, whose festival was held in May. Conversely, the Roman poet Ovid provides a second etymology, in which he says that the month of May is named for the *maiores*, Latin for "elders," and that the following month (June) is named for the *iuniores*, or "young people".



May 5<sup>th</sup> Cinco De Mayo - Cinco de Mayo, or the fifth of May, is a holiday that celebrates the date of the Mexican army's May 5, 1862 victory over France at the battle of Puebla during the Franco-Mexican War.

May 8<sup>th</sup> Mother's Day - Mother's Day is a holiday honoring motherhood that is observed in different forms throughout the world. The American incarnation of Mother's Day was created by Anna Jarvis in 1908 and became an official U.S. holiday in 1914.

May 30<sup>th</sup> Memorial Day - Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military.

- Q- How long will the construction in Raleigh Gardens last?

- Q- When will a model room be ready to view?

- Q- What is the protocol for a resident temporarily leaving the Argyle?
- A- Per state requirements and the resident handbook, all residents must sign out if leaving the Argyle grounds.
- Q- How do residents sign out of the Argyle?
- A- Residents sign out of the Argyle using the Accushield kiosk located next to the front desk. All residents are registered with Accushield when they move into the Argyle.
- Q- What kind of soap does Laundry use on resident clothing?
- A- The Laundry department uses Tide brand laundry detergent on resident clothing. For questions concerning laundry, please contact John Sliz.
- Q- What is the Argyle room tray policy?
- A- Residents needing sick trays must have it approved from either a QMAP, the nurse, or a doctor's note. Sick trays will not be billed. All other room trays will be a charge of five dollars per meal, which may be billed to your monthly statement. For questions about room tray policies, please contact Justina Faulkner, Director of Nursing.
- Q- What if a resident is prescribed a new medication?
- A- When residents are prescribed a new medication, their primary care provider sends an order for that medication to Justina Faulkner. Justina then enters the resident's new medication into their chart on our resident database. Finally, the pharmacy sends the prescription to the Argyle, and it is ready for administration.
